Children's Centre

We have now officially taken over control of the Children's Centre. Thank you to all those parents who supported our application through writing letters, filling in questionnaires, attending meetings etc, your support was very much appreciated. The hard work really does begin now, our aim being to open the building as a nursery in September. Another public consultation now needs to take place to guide Governors in considering lowering the age range of the school.

An important aspect of the development is the safety of the children attending the nursery, and with this in mind, the access road to the building (which is a private road) will only be used by school staff and the residents who live at the end of it. Proposals are in place to put up a new fence along the length of the marked footpath, creating a safe barrier between pedestrians and the road. I would ask for your cooperation in not parking on this road or dropping children off on it. Not only does it cause considerable inconvenience for the residents, but it does cause a very real risk to the safety of our children.
