Pupil Premium Report 2016

The Pupil Premium is funding provided to schools which is additional to main school funding. It is allocated according to the number of pupils on-roll who have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) within the past 6 years, a smaller amount allocated according to the number of children of service families, and an allocation for each pupil who has been 'Looked After' (in care).

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility. However, schools are to be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. Please see below for information regarding how the pupils premium was spent in the last academic year, the impact of this funding, and the plans for future spending.

From September 2015 until August 2016 the school received £1,320 p.a. for each eligible pupil.

Impact of Funding 2015/16 Academic Year

Reading

- In years 4 and 5, the % of PP children at or above age related was significantly above that of others. In year 3 the percentage was the same, and in years 1,2and 6 it was below.
- The KS1 & 2 average % for PP children at age related was 5% lower than that of others
- Average progress made by PP children was higher than that of others in years 5 and 6 but lower in the other year groups.
- The KS1 & 2 average % for progress made PP children was slightly lower than that for others by 3%.

Writing

- The % of PP children at age related is lower than others in all KS1 and 2 classes.
- Accelerated progress was made by PP children in years 2 and 6, average progress in these year groups was higher than that for others.
- The KS1 & 2 average % for progress made PP children was higher than that for others by 2%.

<u>Maths</u>

- The % of PP children at age related n Maths is lower than others in all KS1 and 2 classes except year 3.
- The KS1 & 2 average % for progress made PP children was in line with that for others. Progress of PP children and non-PP was broadly the same in all year groups (Yr 1 was a little lower at 8%).
