Maths - Percentages

Revisit the following:

Equivalence between decimals, fractions and percentages

0.5 is equivalent to $\frac{1}{10}$, 0.25 is equivalent to $\frac{1}{10}$.

• Finding percentages of amounts

Find 20% of 1kg.
