Here are a few more ideas for you this week.

Maths: adding 2 digit numbers

Can you practise adding on two digit numbers? Work within 20 to begin with. Can you show the addition in lots of different ways- writing number sentences, using part whole model, drawing pictures, using tens frames etc. How many ways can you show your additions?

Reading: traditional tales

Can you read/ watch/ retell the story of Little Red Riding Hood? Think about the Big Bad Wolf. What kind of character is he? Draw a picture of the wolf. In a thought bubble, put what he is thinking when he arrives at Grandma's house. How might he be feeling?

English: persuasive writing

Imagine you are the Big Bad Wolf. He is feeling very sorry for himself and is starting to realise how horrible he has been. Write a letter to the Woodcutter explaining how sorry you are and why he should forgive you and let you come back to the wood. Think about how you would persuade him that you have changed.

Phonics: segmenting and blending to read

Practise and recap the sounds from last week. Play a game of buried treasure- write 10 real words and 10 nonsense words onto cards. Turn them over and take it turns to pick a card and read the word. As an extension, can you write the word in a sentence?

Topic: world geography: countries

Can you research a hot country? Think about where in the world that country is, what the people are like there, what they might eat, what they wear, what languages they speak. Are there different kinds of animals there? You could create a poster, leaflet, fact-file or use whatever way of presenting your work you would like.


