
Dear Year 3,

### <u>Topic</u>

Here is a volcano, like one you might find in Japan!



You need to conduct some research on how a volcano is formed. You can either write your own step-by-step stages of how a volcano is formed or use the labels below to help you. The lava and ash that have erupted through the crust build up to form the classic volcano cone shape over time.

This process is happening all the time! Pressure builds up inside the Earth.

This then affects the Earth's crust, so that magma can sometimes erupt through it.

# <u>English</u>

"What's for tea?" she asked. "Delicious ants!" her mum replied.


Punctuation, such as question marks, full stops and exclamation marks go inside the speech marks.

Famous musicians often perform at the opening and closing ceremonies of the Games. Choose a selection of artists / bands that you would like to perform at the next event.




Can you create a singing and dancing performance using the songs of your choice to show people at home?


### <u>Art/Design</u>
