






Year 5 Home Learning (Sheet 7)

What do Hindus believe?

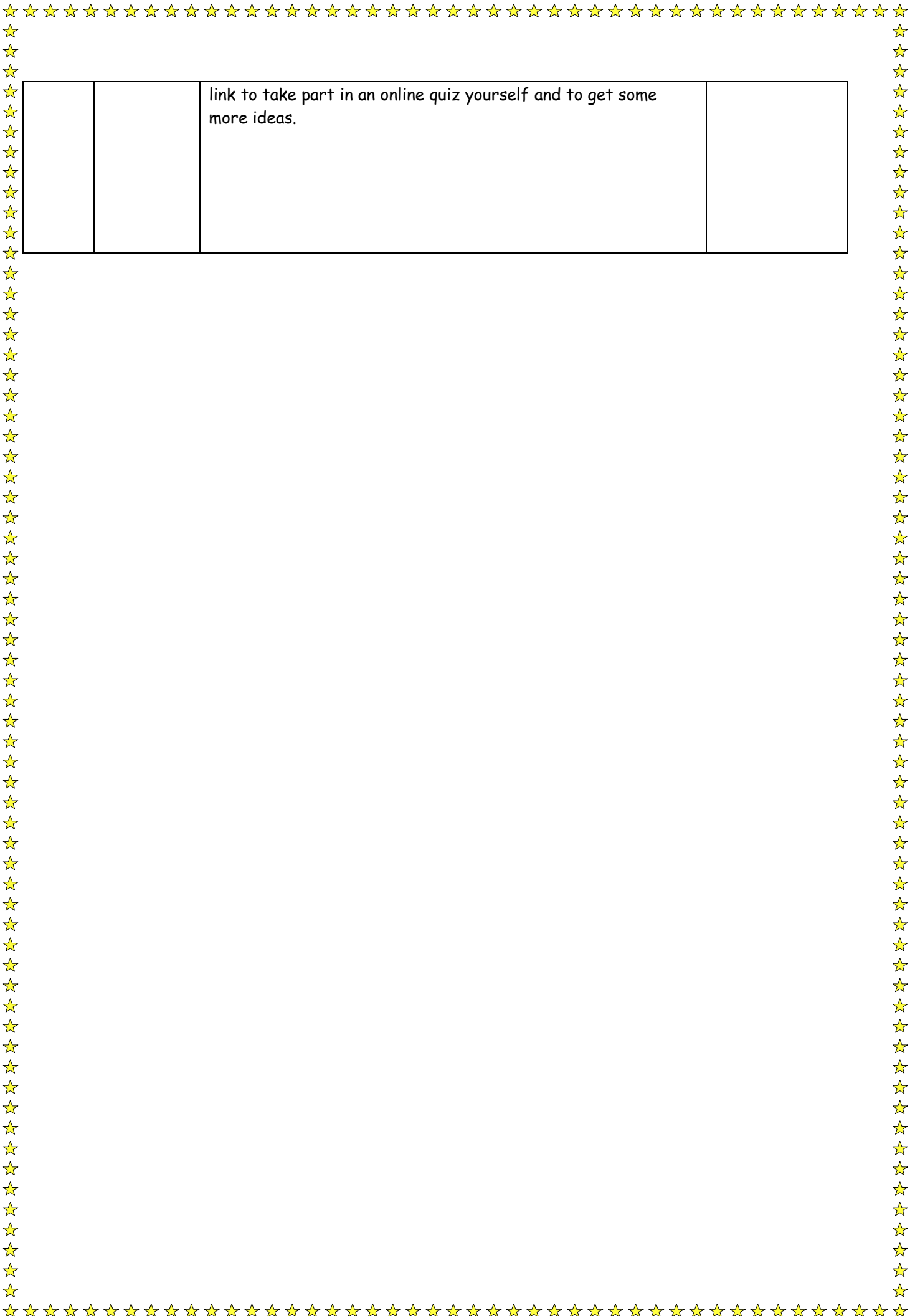
