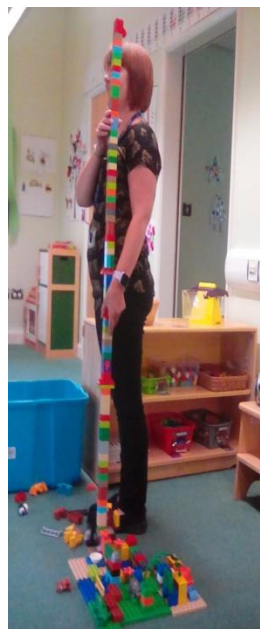


Hello everyone,

This week in nursery, the children have been learning about Jack and the Beanstalk so we have planted some beans and will watch with excitement to see how tall they grow.

Maybe you could have a go at some of the activities we have been doing linked to Jack and the Beanstalk.

- You could watch and listen to the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, this is the one we have looked at in school. <https://learnenglishkids.britishcouncil.org/short-stories/jack-and-the-beanstalk> or you might have the book at home.
- We drew around lots of feet to see which was the biggest, can you have a go at drawing around the feet of the people in your house. Maybe you could cut them out. We then looked around the nursery for things that were longer than our footprint or shorter than our footprint. Maybe you can have a go at doing this too.
- The children really enjoyed measuring so they used the bricks to build a really tall tower. It was even taller than me! Can you build a tall tower; maybe you could build a tower that is taller than you.



- We then used the links to see who could make the longest chain. Maybe you could use something at home to make long lines. You might line all your cars or trains up in a long traffic jam. Or you could line up your teddy bears and see how far the line stretches.



I hope you have lots of fun doing these measuring activities and I can't wait to hear all about your adventures.
