English: This week for reading, I'd like you to do 5 things.

1. Make a reading den in your house. You could make it closed off and cosy or have room for a few people to sit down and enjoy reading together.

2. Use a book and find 4 tricky words. Use rainbow colours to write them down and find out what the word means.

3. Read a non-fiction book and write down 5 facts you have learned

4. If you could be any book character in the world, who would you be and why?

5. Create a WANTED poster for the Big Bad Wolf.

Science: This week we're going to think about the environment and everyday materials again.

Activity 1: Can you make a list using words/ drawings to find all the things in your home that use electricity? How can you record the information that you see? Are there any items in your house that are using electricity that aren't being used and are wasting electricity?

Activity 2: If you could keep only one item which would it be? Why? Can you explain or write some sentences to show your thinking?

Activity 3: Find 5 things in your house. What materials are they made from? Why do you think they are made from those materials? Can you name the properties of the different materials? Can you squash it? Bend it? Stretch it? Does it change shape?

#### Topic:

We've still been looking at castles, knights and dragons in school, so this week I'd like you to design your own Knight who can protect your castle against Dragons or anyone else. Firstly, I'd like you to research what Knights wore and used to protect them.

Then I'd like you to draw your own Knight – use this link to help you draw it – label the drawing with the names of the armour and then colour it in. You could even use the coat of armour you designed for your family on the Knight's shield.

#### **AIM OF THE GAME**

#### EQUIPMENT

All that is needed is any kind of ball and a safe space indoors or outside next to a wall.

HOW TO PLAY With a ball and in a safe space, stand facing a wall.

The player rolls, kicks or throws the ball against the wall. As it bounces off the wall, let it pass between their legs, before quickly turning around and collecting the ball.

For more than one player, try to hit the ball against the wall so it comes straight back through the other player's legs without them having to move. They need to turn around and try to collect it as quick as possible.

**<u>Maths</u>**: This week, we're looking at fractions and finding halves  $\frac{1}{2}$  and quarters  $\frac{1}{4}$ 

The numerator tells you how many parts we have

The denominator represents the number of equal parts that makes a whole.
