<u>Maths</u>

Have a go at this week's maths challenge grid.

You can use sharing to solve division problems. When you are dividing (÷), you need to share the overall amount with the given number.

So 16 ÷ 4 would see me sharing 16 things between 4, leaving me with an answer of 4.



<u>Design</u>

Japan has a notorious earthquake history. About 1,500 earthquakes strike the island nation every year. Minor tremors occur on a nearly daily basis.

I would like you to design and build a bridge that would be able to withstand an earthquake or a tsunami.

Have a look at bridges. How are they made? What are they used for?

Select appropriate materials to make your bridge strong. Be inventive!
