<u>Science</u>: Since the weather has been so beautiful, I'd like you to do some outside learning this week. If possible, I'd like you to go on a walk and try to complete the scavenger hunt below by ticking off the items that you've found. Before you touch anything, make sure you ask an adult if it's safe to touch it and if you find any small creatures or insects be sure to keep their habitat safe!

<u>Art</u>: Hopefully some of you have seen your sunflowers sprout. If not, we're going to create our own Sunflowers this week in art so don't worry.

Firstly, I'd like you to research Vincent Van Gogh's Sunflowers painting. How does it make you feel? What season does it remind you of?

Secondly I'd like you to create your own piece of art using sunflowers. Here's some suggested instructions below.

You will need:

- Yellow or white paper
- Yellow paint
- Brown or black tissue paper
- Black or green card if you don't have coloured card, you can always just colour paper.



Cut a saucer sized circle out of the brown or black card.



Once dry cut out the hand prints. Then stick them around the edge of the circle, making sure that they overlap slightly.



Using yellow and light orange paint, print hand prints onto the yellow or white paper. Do this until you have enough to go around the edge of the circle, then leave to dry.



- Once dry, put PVA glue in the middle of the black circle and use this to stick scrunched up tissue paper. Do this until the circle is completely covered, then leave to dry.
- Using PVA glue add a strip of green card to the back of the black circle to create the stem, then leave to dry.
