Where was it hiding? Is it under a chair, or on top of the cupboard, maybe it's between the cushions on the sofa? Can you take it in turns with someone else in your family to hide the toy? I would love to see pictures of your toy hiding and I would also like to know how you described where your toy was hiding.

We also looked at a picture from the story of lost and found. I've added this to the end of my letter. I would like you to have a look at this picture with a grown up and see if you can find the following things;

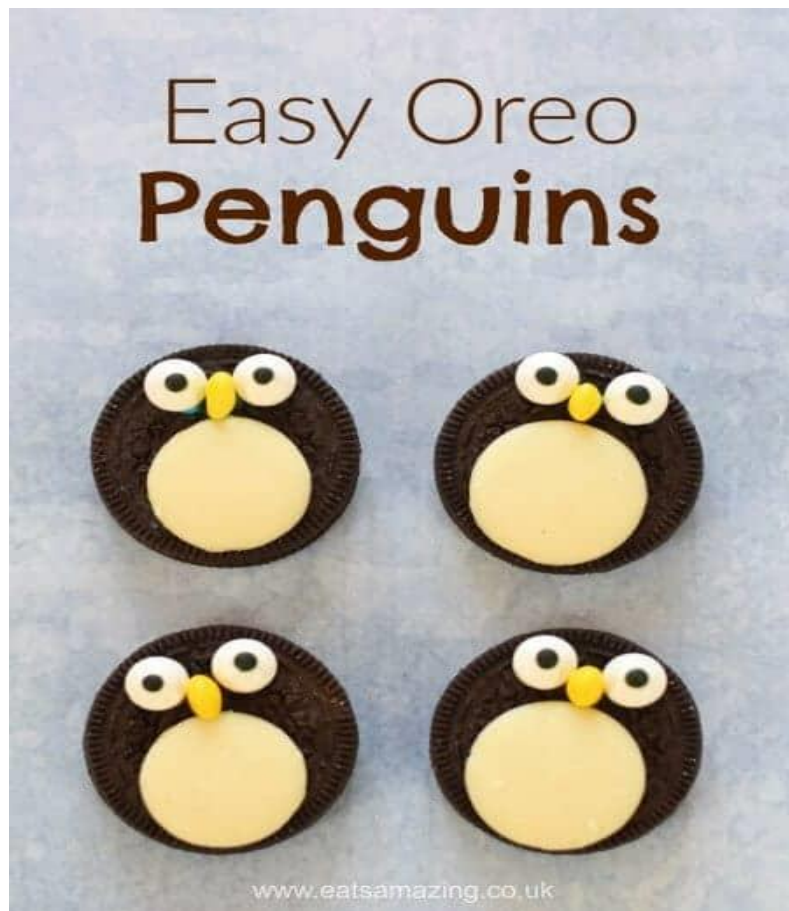
- An umbrella
- Penguins, how many can you find?
- The sun
- Ducks, how many can you find?
- A seagull
- A boy
- A boat

The children in nursery are doing lots of mark making in nursery and there is a pencil control sheet for you to have a go at. Can you give the snowman eyes, a carrot nose, and a mouth? You might want to add arms, a hat and buttons. In the space next to the snowman can you draw a snowman of your own? You could ask your grown up to put your name on the back and then you can write on top of it to practise writing your name. I would love to see a picture of this if you can send me one on class dojo.

In maths this week we will be looking at counting objects. I've made a little video of an activity that we will be doing in class. You might like to have a go at this activity or you might like to make your own counting activity. You can count almost anything! I can't wait to see the pictures of you doing lots of counting.

You will need;

- A packet of oreo biscuits
- Giant white chocolate buttons
- Icing
- We are using mini chocolate chips for the eyes.
- We are using yellow ready rolled icing for the beak, but you could add food colouring to the icing or maybe you have another idea for the beak.

How to make;

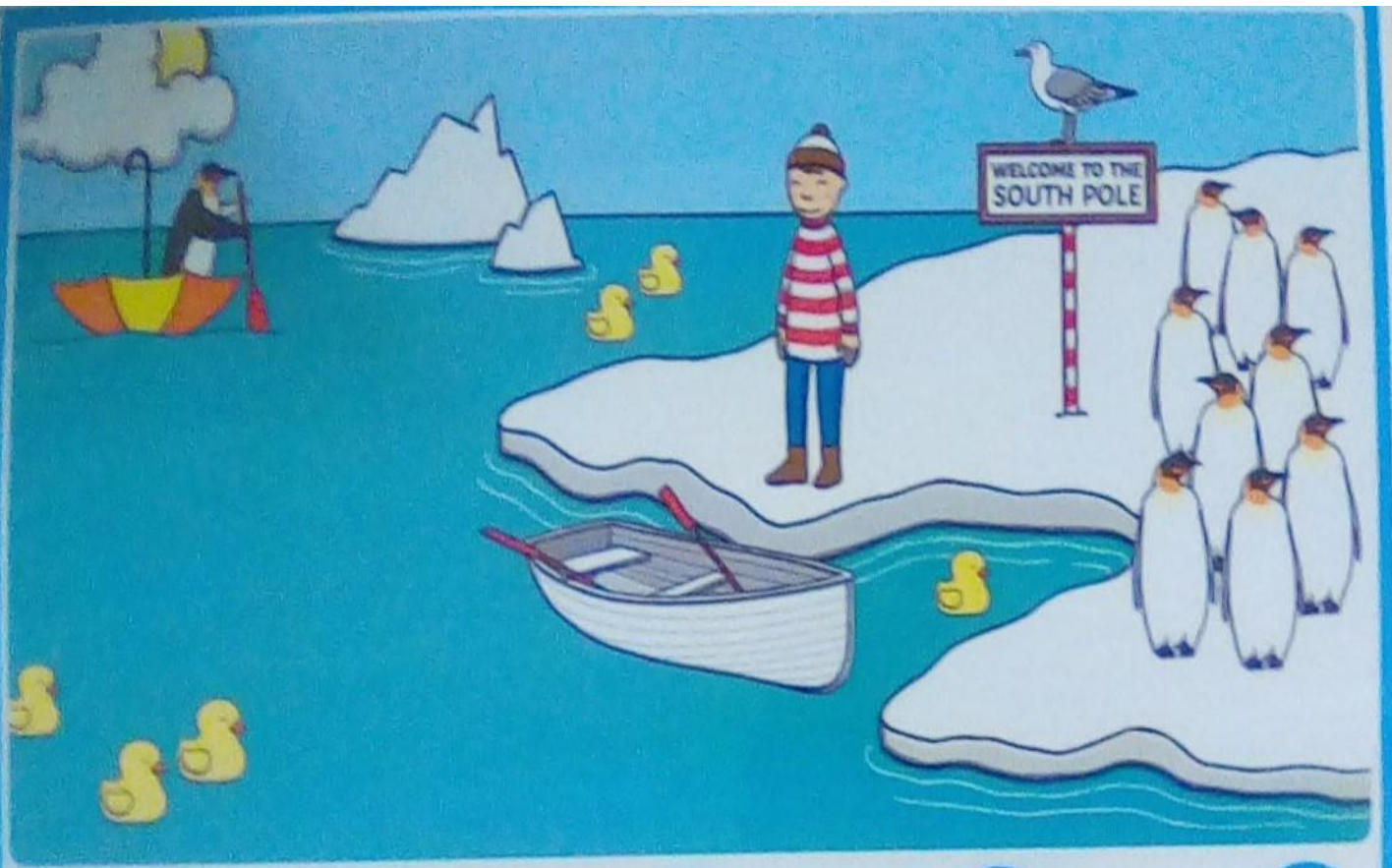
- First squeeze a little bit of icing onto the back of each white button and place it on the oreo to make the penguin's tummy.
- Next squeeze two little dots of icing to make the eyes; we will be adding a chocolate chip to each eye.
- Next you will need to roll a tiny ball of yellow icing for the beak
- Finally, I would love to see a picture of your penguins before you eat them!

Have lots of fun making your penguins and of course eating them!!
