

Amelia was born on 24th July 1897 in Atchison, Kansas in the United States. She is famous for being the first female pilot to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean.

Amelia's Childhood

Amelia lived with her mother, father and her younger sister, Grace Muriel. Amelia loved having adventures with her sister. They would climb trees and hunt for rats.

Unusually for the time, the Earhart sisters were allowed to wear bloomers rather than dresses like other girls in their neighbourhood. Amelia was also inspired by successful women with jobs that were usually only done by men.

Amelia's Flying Adventures

Amelia had her first flying lesson when she was just 23 years old. In July 1921, she bought her first plane. It was bright yellow and she named it 'The Canary' after the yellow bird.

In May 1923, she got her pilot's licence. Amelia was the 16th woman in the United States to receive one. After many joint adventures, in May 1932 she became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean.

Amelia's Last Adventure

On 20th May 1937, Amelia and her navigator (Fred Noonan) began their biggest adventure to fly all the way around the world. They planned a journey of 29,000 miles. On 2nd July

1937, Amelia and Fred tried to make the next flight from New Guinea to Howland Island. Unfortunately, due to poor weather and low fuel, Amelia and Fred never made it to Howland Island. A lighthouse was built on Howland Island in Amelia's memory.



After leaving school, Amelia worked as a nurse's assistant in Canada. She cared for wounded soldiers from the First World War.
