# Maths

## Overview

Children have looked at weight. We are now going to look at height, we will explore the language used when discussing and comparing how long or short something is



# Maths

We are learning about measuring and how **long** or **tall** something is.

We are learning about how **long** or **short** things are.

We will use the words **longer** and **shorter** to compare the lengths of items.

You may also include words like **tall** or **taller** – **short** or **shorter**.

## Measuring Caterpillar Lengths

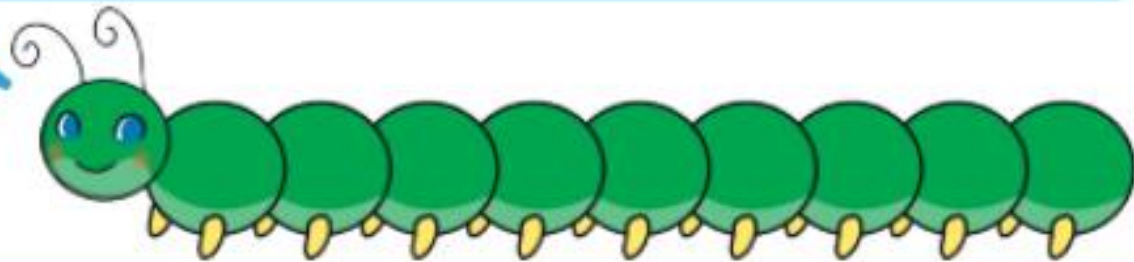
Hello! My name is Connor, the caterpillar.

Can you find out which of my friends are shorter than me and which ones are longer than me?

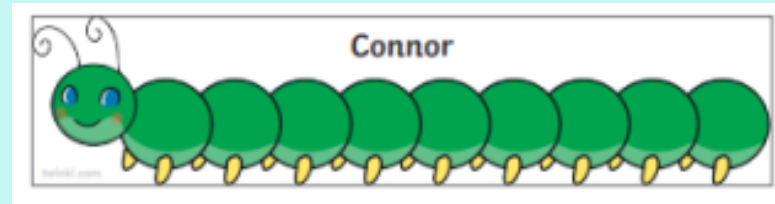
Can you sort the caterpillars into sets? You could have a set for the caterpillars that are shorter than me, a set for the caterpillars that are longer than me and another set for caterpillars that are the same length as me.

Can you order the caterpillars from shortest to longest? Where am I in the line of caterpillars?

Caterpillars that are **shorter** than Connor



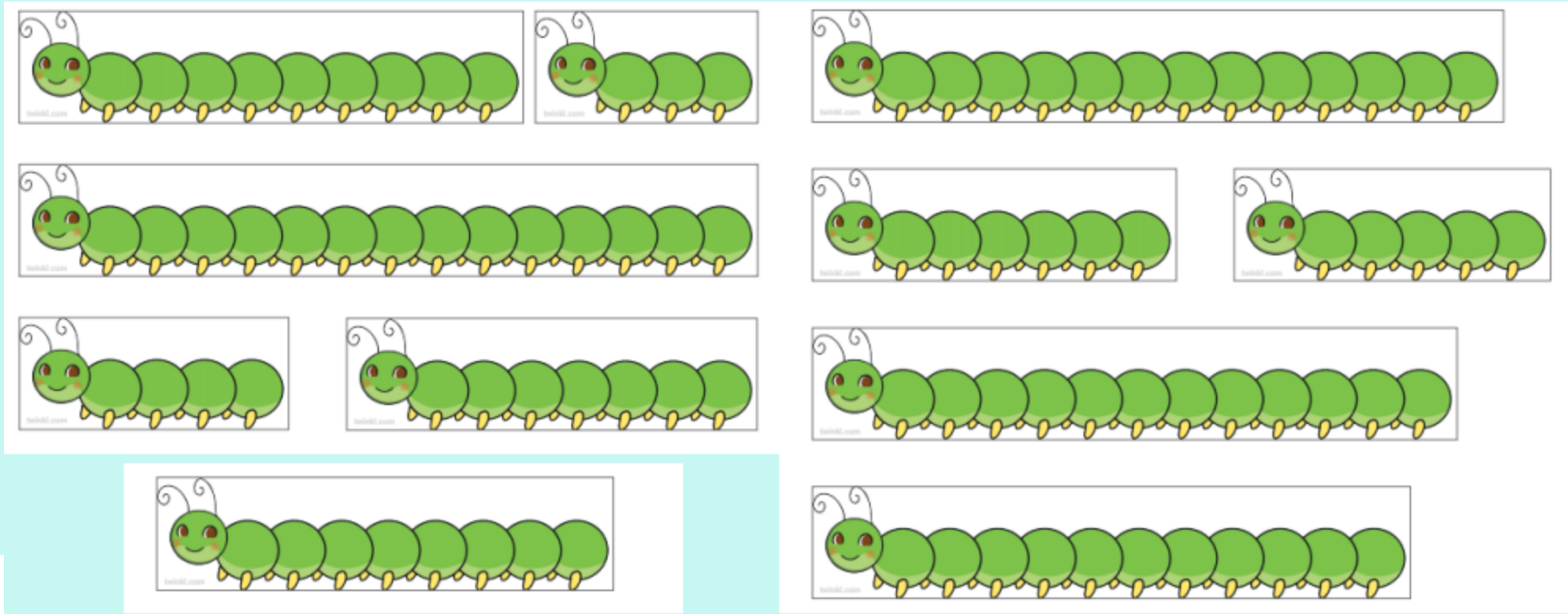
Caterpillars that are the **same length** as Connor

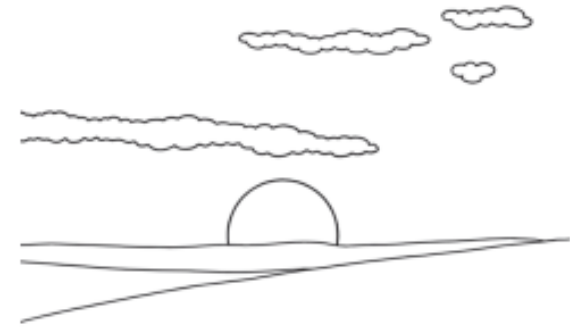

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# Forest School

## Natural Materials Winter Craft Activity Rainbow-Inspired Leaf Collage

At a time of year when there aren't many beautiful, bright flowers around, make the most of the colours of the leaves that you can find to make this beautiful leaf rainbow collage.

### You will need:

- Rainbow-inspired template printed on card (A3 is recommended)
- A selection of leaves in four different colours
- White glue (such as PVA)

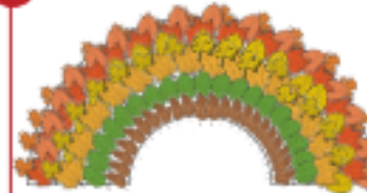

Leaves come in different colours, such as orange, yellow, purple, red, green or brown. Choose four of these colours. Go on a leaf hunt and gather leaves for each colour chosen. If they are wet, leave them to dry before use.

Use the rainbow-inspired template. Put glue in one of the bands. Choose one of your leaf colours and fill the band with leaves of that colour.

Repeat the same for all of the bands until they are filled.

Where will you display your rainbow-inspired collage to bring colour to the winter months?

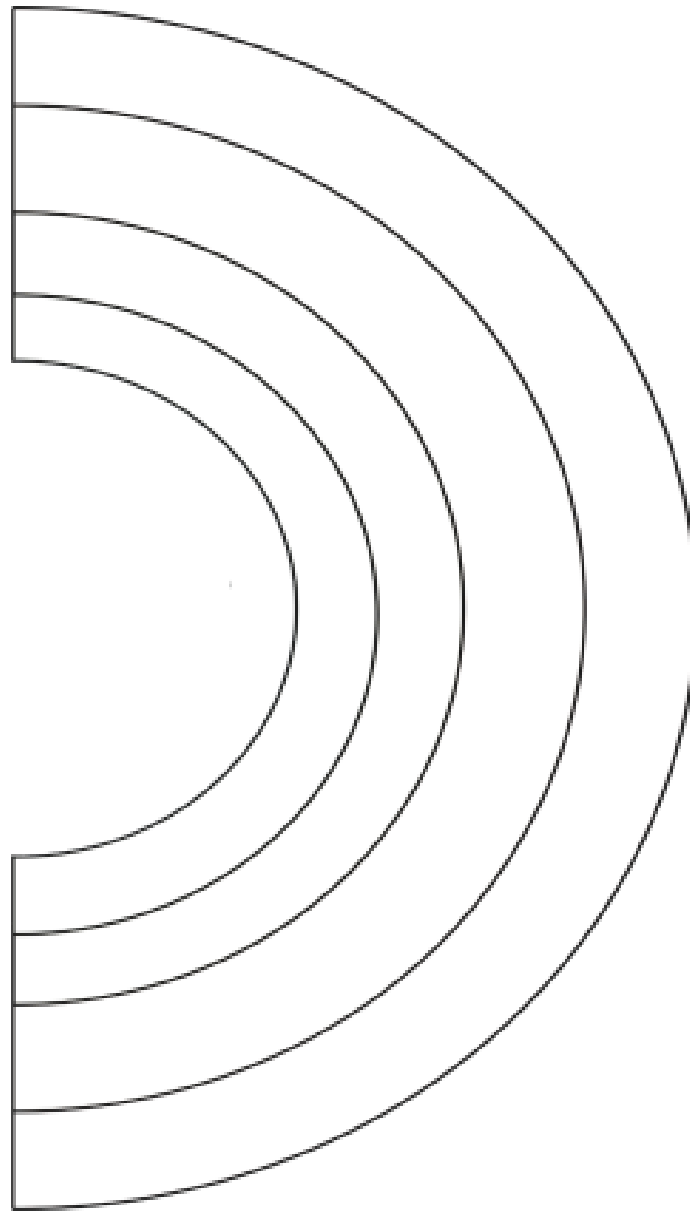
Move onto another band. Put glue in the next band. Choose a new colour of leaf. Fill the band with leaves of that colour.

# Forest School

## Natural Materials Winter Craft Activity Hedgehog Camouflage Collage

Help your hedgehog with his camouflage by using natural materials like leaves, moss or twigs to create this collage.

### You will need:

- Hedgehog template printed onto card
- Leaves and other natural resources (moss, twigs, etc.)
- Glue
- Brown and black paint



1.

Collect some natural materials:

- leaves
- moss
- twigs

Leave them to dry.



2.

What colour is a hedgehog? Paint its tummy, face and legs. Don't forget to give it an eye, a nose and a mouth.



4.

Let's cover his back in spiky quills.

Put glue on the hedgehog's back. Use the leaves, twigs and moss to cover his back. Try to lay them so they point outwards.



3.

Put glue on the leaf outlines by the hedgehog's feet. Choose some of the leaves you found outside and stick them on so it looks like your hedgehog is walking through leaves.

How does he look? Can you spot your hedgehog hiding in the leaves?
