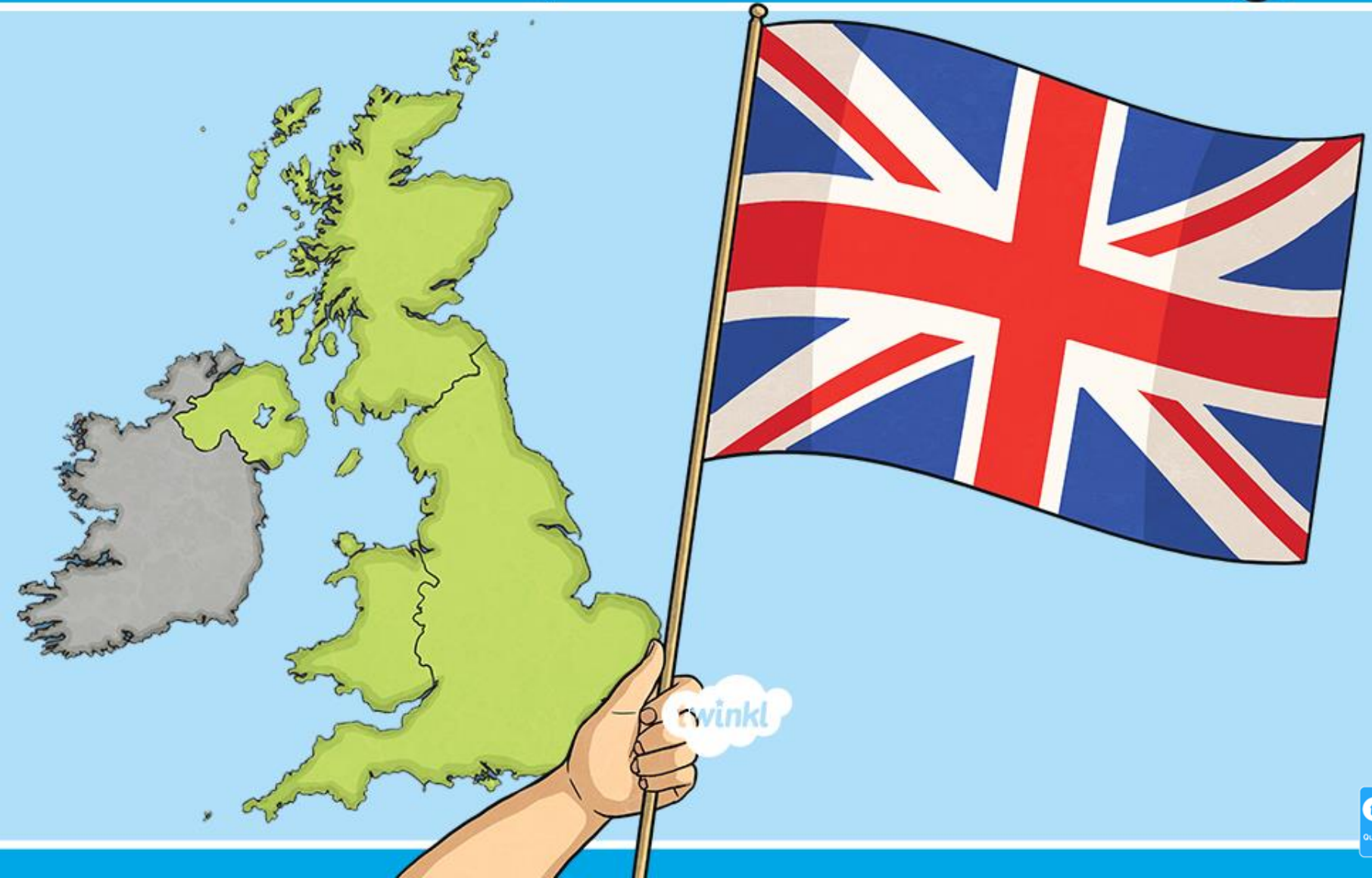

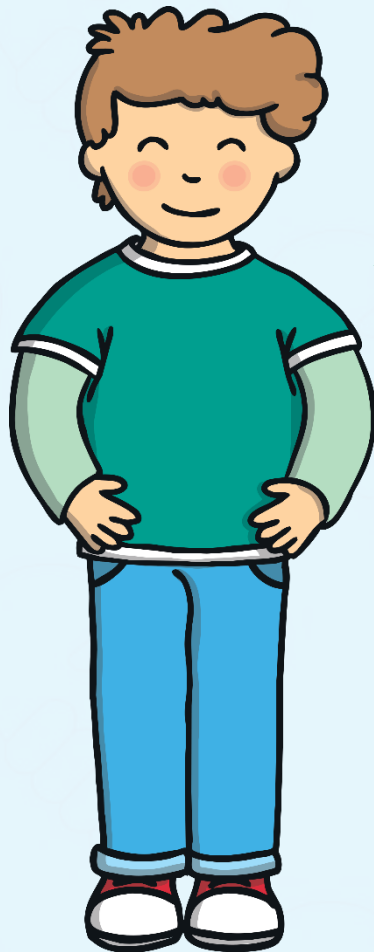

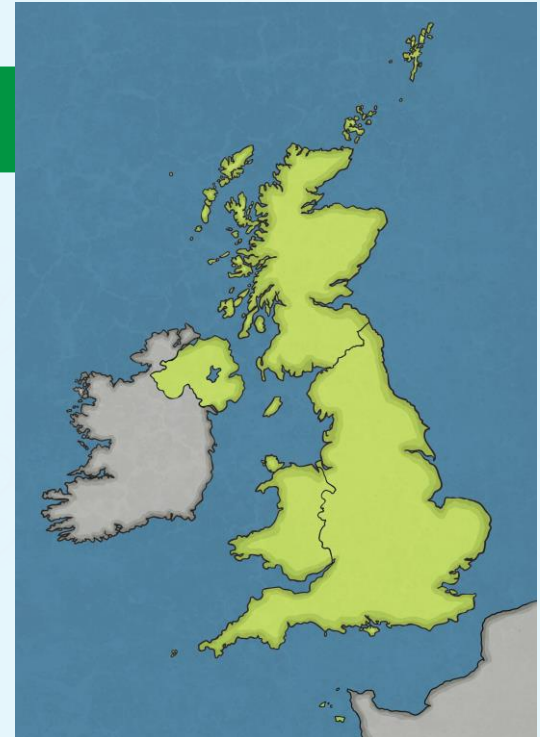

Britain

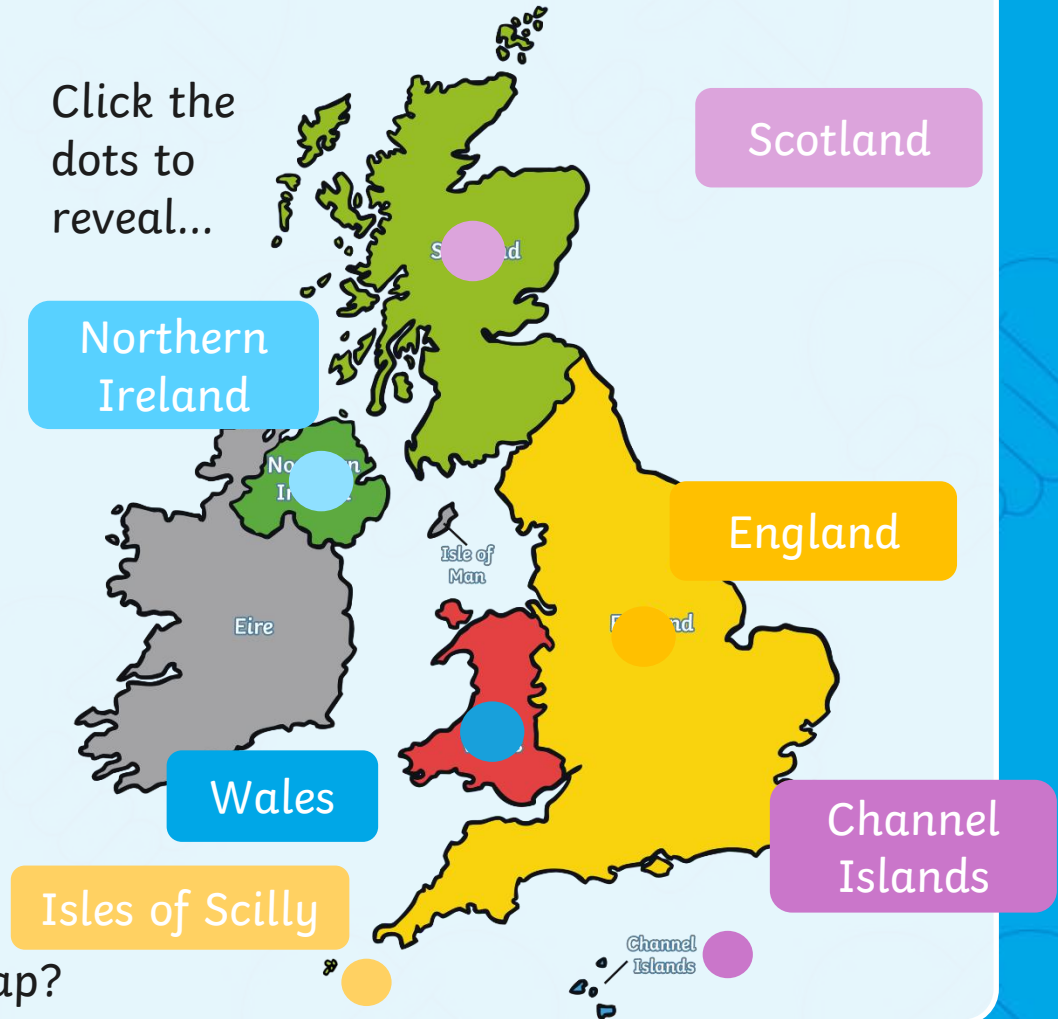


This is a map of **The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland**.
