Sports Premium 2022-23

East Ayton Primary School received a Sports Premium grant of £17 700 for the academic year 2022-23.

How the allocation will be spent:

Action – Training for staff in developing specific skills e.g. Gymnastics

Reason – Continue to develop teacher knowledge and skills in delivering specific areas of the PE curriculum

Action – Replace and add to existing indoor and outdoor PE equipment.

Reason – continue the process of replacing PE equipment in school which is old and needs updating, this includes internal resources such as benches, and equipment for outdoor activity such as new netball posts

Action - Allowing all children access to swimming lessons each year.

Reason – Continue to provide swimming lessons for children in all year groups during the 2022-23 academic year to build on the progress made this year in developing water confidence and swimming skills

Action – Specific training for all staff in teaching swimming

Reason – Enhance our swimming offer to children by training all teaching staff members to deliver high quality swimming teaching

Action – Contributions to 2 residential visits to East Barnby and Bewerley Park

Reason – To develop the outdoor activities aspect of the PE curriculum by adding another residential to the curriculum. These residential visits will develop bushcraft skills, along with allowing children to access rock climbing, kayaking, caving etc.

Action - Fund part of a role within existing ATA capacity to support playtime and lunchtime activities, and after-school clubs.

Reason – Funding a role which will encourage participation in games and activities at lunch & playtimes. The role will involve organising activities and resources during in the day and also after school.

Action – Funding staff members to train for their mini bus licence. Funding greater access to mini-buses.

Reason - School can access mini-buses belonging to local schools and has drivers on staff. This will allow increased opportunities to take children into the wider local environment to engage in a greater variety of outdoor activities.

Action – Funding to develop the Forest Schools area, increasing the size of the area to include the adventure playground.

Reason – The existing area needs expanding so new areas can be introduced – pond area, wild area, growing. Re-developing the adventure playground area will allow for increased learning opportunities.
