Summer 2 - Medium Term Plan

Topic: Rumbles and Eruptions



English

In English during Summer 2, the children will write a narrative based on 'Escape from Pompeii'. The children will look to use the text to write their own short stories with their own imaginative ending. After writing a narrative, the children will write an explanation text on how a volcano erupts. To finish off the school year the children will write some poetry on earthquakes and volcanos.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths we will be following the 'White Rose Maths' scheme. During Summer 2, the children will look at shape and statistics. In order to master the work the children will look at the following small steps:

- Turns and angles
- **Right angles**
- Compare angles
- Measure and draw accurately
- Horizontal and vertical
- Parallel and perpendicular
- Recognise and describe 2-D shapes
- Draw polygons
- Recognise and describe 3-D shapes
- Make 3-D shapes

Science

In Science during Summer 2, the children will revisit previous topics and will carry out scientific investigations across the different areas of year 3 science. The children will revisit the following areas:

- Animals, including humans
- Plants
- Rocks
- Light
- Forces

Art/Design and Technology

In art the children will explore Hokusai themed art. The children will also make a model of a volcano in design and technology too.

Music

Geography

In geography during summer 2, the children will be looking at 'Extreme Earth'. The children will explore what is underground, how volcanoes are formed and the affect volcanoes have on people's lives. The children will also learn about how volcanoes are measured and what causes tsunamis and tornadoes. By the end of the unit of work the children should be able to do the following:

- Name the layers that make up the Earth;
- Name the key parts of a volcano; -
- Show where most volcanoes are found;
- Explain how to keep safe during an earthquake;
- Describe a tsunami;
- Describe the damage caused by a tsunami; -
- Explain how tornadoes form;
- Describe how scientists collect data about storms.

<u>History</u>

During Summer 2 the children will focus on geography meaning that history is not looked at.

French

In French during Summer 2, the children will learn about the different days of the week and months. The children will develop skills such as:

- Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding.
- Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.

Computing

The children will develop their computing knowledge and skills using 'Rising Stars'. During Summer 2, the children will explore the unit 'We are opinion pollsters'. The children will create their own online opinion poll, seek responses and then analyse the results. The children will also create charts to represent data and will produce a brief, illustrated report.
