

To parents/carers,

Firstly, I hope you managed to have a lovely Easter break. School was incredibly busy before the Easter holidays as the children worked incredibly hard on our 'Food, Glorious Food' topic whilst also working tirelessly for the Easter performances. It was fantastic to see lots of you at the parent appointments and to be able to give some amazing feedback of how the children had done during the Spring term. Let's hope for more of the same during the final term of the school year.

Just to remind you that the children will continue to do PE on a Thursday and Friday. If the children could ensure they have their PE kit in school on those days that would be amazing. The children need to make sure that they have a plain white t-shirt and navy blue shorts. As the weather gets warmer, we will endeavour to do PE outside too.
