To parents/carers,

Firstly, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy New Year. I hope you all had a fantastic Christmas. It was brilliant seeing so many of you in school in the lead up to Christmas. Whilst the Spring term will be slightly less manic, it looks set to be another busy period in school.

During the Spring term the children have PE on a Tuesday and Thursday. I would really appreciate if the children could have both indoor and outdoor clothing so that we are prepared for both scenarios. Children should have a plain white t-shirt, blue shorts, tracksuit bottoms and a jumper in case the weather is cold. Children are also required to have trainers in school too.

Similarly, to the Autumn Term, the children will be set homework on a Friday and will have a week to complete the activities. A typical week of homework includes ten spellings, a maths or English based task and some weekly reading.
